BIBLICAL DOCTRINE 2: CHRISTOLOGY AND THEOLOGICAL ANTHROPOLOGY

The Biblical Doctrine courses equip gospel workers with a comprehensive understanding of biblical faith based on gospel-centered theology. Studying Biblical Doctrine courses helps us become competent Bible teachers and messengers to advance the kingdom of God in our lives and ministries. The Biblical Doctrine 2 course focuses on Christology and theological anthropology. Each theme is examined in detail from biblical and gospel-centered perspectives, and practical applications are explored.

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NEW TESTAMENT GREEK



- Course Instructor: Dr. Ezra Cho (Ph.D., New Testament of Asbury Seminary; Pauline Theology)
- Meeting Days and Times: Tuesday, 8-10 pm EDT. (Start date: **Feb 27**)

This course will focus on introducing the basic/intermediate Koine Greek. Through this class, we will learn the basic/intermediate Greek grammar, syntax, and methods of how to use Greek grammar devices. After successfully completing this course, students will understand the overall

Greek Grammar and syntax and, furthermore, will know how to interpret the New Testament with the original language of Greek.

Session 2 (Mar 12): The Greek Verb System (A Bird's Eye View: Inflection, Mood, Voice, and Tense)

Session 3 (Mar 26): Syntax of Nouns & Personal Pronouns (Introducing the Greek Cases, Genders, and Number)

Session 4 (Apr 9): Syntax of Adjectives & Prepositions (The Inflection of Adjectives & the Nature of Prepositions)

Session 5 (Apr 23): Syntax of Verbs & Verbal I (Voice: Active, Middle, & Passive; Mood: Indicative, Subjunctive, Optative, & Imperative)

Session 6 (May 7): Syntax of Verbs & Verbal II (Tense & Aspect: Present, Imperfect, Aorist, Future, and Perfect; The Infinitive; The Participle)

Session 7 (May 21): Practice of how to use BibleWorks and Bible Hub (Greek Supplementary Devices)
